March 1: *Selma* (2014)

A chronicle of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s 1965 campaign to secure equal voting rights via an epic march from Selma to Montgomery, Alabama. Rated PG-13. 2 hours, 18 minutes. **Director: Ava DuVernay**

March 8: *The Piano* (1993)

In the 1850s, a mute woman is sent to New Zealand, along with her young daughter and prized piano, for an arranged marriage to a wealthy landowner. However, a local plantation worker makes her the focus of his attentions. Rated R. 2 hours, 1 minute. **Director/Writer: Jane Campion**

March 15: *Sleepless in Seattle* (1993)

A boy calls a radio talk show in an attempt to find his recently widowed father a partner. Rated PG. 1 hour, 45 minutes. **Director/Writer: Nora Ephron**

March 22: *Queen of Katwe* (2016)

A Ugandan girl sees her world rapidly change after being introduced to the game of chess. Rated PG. 2 hours, 4 minutes. **Director: Mira Nair**

March 29: *Belle* (2013)

The mixed-race daughter of a Royal Navy Admiral is raised by her aristocratic great-uncle in 18th century England. Rated PG. 1 hour, 40 minutes. **Directed by: Amma Asante**
