

LIBRARY WILL BE ENLARGED

**NYA to Catalogue Books at
New City School---Gifts to
Be Solicited.**

Plans for cataloguing and adding to the existing school library at the New City School were made at a meeting held yesterday under the direction of Mrs. Edith Switz of Orangeburg, supervisor of the rural library service for the counties of Rockland, Putnam, Westchester, Suffolk and Nassau.

The existing stock of books is to be enlarged, it is hoped, by contributions from residents of the vicinity and the library service made available to adults of the district. A National Youth Administration employe will be used to handle this distribution of volumes in the new set up.

As a result of yesterday's meeting a committee was formed to organize a book collection campaign. The committee is to consist of Mrs. Clement Feeley, Mrs. Charles Youman, and Mrs. J. Karrell. Those who would like to contribute books to the library are requested to either send them in or communicate with a member of this committee.

This is part of a plan to extend library service to rural communities throughout the State and is sponsored by the library extension division of the State Education Department. Mrs. Mary F. Mason is to direct the activities of this movement assisted by ten supervisors for different districts throughout the State. Ultimately regular library hours will be designated for every community so that two or three afternoons or evenings a week, people of such communities may borrow and exchange books.
